

LGU El Salvador City Launches Electronic Business Permit and Licensing System

Processing of business permit renewal started last January 4, 2021 to end on January 20, 2021. Historically, businesses tend to process their renewal only when deadline is fast approaching, peaking on the day of the deadline itself. To avoid the possible influx of people, an ordinance was issued extending the deadline to February 26, 2021.

1,304 businesses were processed and amount assessed totalled to P44,038,028.79. Freebies were given to top 10 early birds sponsored by Mayor Edgar S. Lignes. This year serves as a milestone given that we have successfully implemented the electronic business permit and licensing system, a

program that was granted by the Department of Information and Technology. Through this system, permit processing is expedited and made easy on for our clients. CITY VETERINARY ACTIVITIES

Within the First Quarter of 2021, we have served 732 heads of animals for treatment. 774 heads of animals for vitamin supplementation, 375 heads of large animals for deworming including the cattle's of 4P's beneficiaries at Barangay Ulaliman, El Salvador City, 1,120 heads of small animals for deworming, 234 heads of animals (dogs and cats) vaccinated against Rabies Virus, 55 heads of cattle vaccinated against Hemorrhagic Septicemia for dispersal Barangay Taytay and Himaya. El Salvador City will be brought to Lagonglong. Misamis Oriental, 35 heads of animals catered for castration and 1 head for skin laceration repair (see Table 1).

Our office conducted a meat inspection service for the meat vendors of El Salvador City of which 348 heads of porcine and 47 heads of Bovine inspected for slaughter at the same time

we conducted a post-mortem inspection (see Table 2). We also had an animal inspection service for the live animals prior to travel to ensure that the animals are healthy (see Table 3). We have issued 429 copies of Veterinary Health Certificate for the animal to travel and to be slaughtered. The team responded to the African Swine Fever (ASF) outbreak within the neighboring municipalities and city.

On the other hand, Republic Act 9482 or Anti-Rabies Act of 2007 was implemented in the city, as a response an impounding area for stray dogs was established and it started first in Barangay Molugan as per request through resolution. We are accepting walk-in clients for animal consultations, while the "OKSYON" market is still operating but strictly NO SWINE as part of bio-security.
